Guiding the Conversation

Questions for discussion

Brainstorm a list of the social and academic challenges that these students face. Which ones do students in your school face?

In your experience, what other examples have you seen of challenges that newcomer students and/or their parents encounter?

Were there any challenges these students mentioned that surprised you? Were there any challenges arising from behavioural expectations that are taken for granted in our schools? How could these challenges have been avoided?

What could you do in your class or school that would address some of the challenges discussed?

What common themes emerged about the immigrant experience?

What are the implications of increasing numbers of immigrant students entering our school system?
