

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ORGANIZATION OF THIS DOCUMENT

The social studies list of authorized resources is organized in three parts.

Part I: Authorized Resource List (listed by grade)

Resources are listed alphabetically for each resource authorization category within each grade. Authorized Student Basic Resources are listed first, related Teaching Resources are listed second, and Student Support and Teaching Resources are listed last within each grade. Annotations for resources appear in Part II of the resource list. Each resource listed in Part I identifies the:

- series name, if applicable
- title of resource
- type of authorization (student basic, student support, teaching)
- grade(s) authorized for
- vendor/distributor name, order number and price
- type of resource (text, video, CD-ROM).

Part II: Annotated Bibliography of Authorized Resources (listed alphabetically by title)

NEW SOCIAL STUDIES RESOURCES

Resource Authorization Categories

This social studies resource list is for Kindergarten to Grade 9 resources that have been authorized for use in Alberta schools. Alberta Education selects and authorizes the best possible instructional materials for the implementation of approved programs of study. The resource authorization categories are **student basic**, **student support** or **teaching**, and the status is noted for each resource.

Student Basic learning resources are those student learning resources authorized by Alberta Education as the most appropriate for addressing the majority of outcomes of the course(s) or substantial components of the course(s); or the most appropriate for meeting general outcomes across two or more grade levels.

Student Support learning resources are those student learning resources authorized by Alberta Education to assist in addressing some of the outcomes of the course(s) or components of the course(s); or to assist in meeting the outcomes across two or more grade levels.

Teaching resources are those teaching resources identified as the best available resources to support the implementation of programs of study and course(s); they may be teacher resources to accompany student resources or teacher professional resources. The authorized teaching resources are listed with the student resources.

The list of these resources is organized by grade and alphabetically.

Note: Alberta Education strongly recommends that teachers read all selections in the student resources and all activities in the teaching resources prior to using them with students, including review of contents on Web site links made within resources as Alberta Education is not responsible for maintaining these sites. Careful consideration should be given to the sensitivities of both the student audience and the community.

OVERVIEW OF PROGRAM OF STUDIES

SOCIAL STUDIES KINDERGARTEN TO GRADE 12

Program Rationale and Philosophy

Social studies provides opportunities for students to develop the attitudes, skills and knowledge that will enable them to become engaged, active, informed and responsible citizens. Recognition and respect for individual and collective identity is essential in a pluralistic and democratic society. Social studies helps students develop their sense of self and community, encouraging them to affirm their place as citizens in an inclusive, democratic society.

Program Vision

The Alberta Social Studies Kindergarten to Grade 12 Program of Studies meets the needs and reflects the nature of 21st century learners. It has, at its heart, the concepts of citizenship and identity in the Canadian context. The program reflects multiple perspectives, including Aboriginal and Francophone, that contribute to Canada's evolving realities. It fosters the building of a society that is pluralistic, bilingual, multicultural, inclusive and democratic. The program emphasizes the importance of diversity and respect for differences as well as the need for social cohesion and the effective functioning of society. It promotes a sense of belonging and acceptance in students as they engage in active and responsible citizenship at the local, community, provincial, national and global level.

Central to the vision of the Alberta social studies program is the recognition of the diversity of experiences and perspectives and the pluralistic nature of Canadian society. Pluralism builds upon Canada's historical and constitutional foundations, which reflect the country's Aboriginal heritage, bilingual nature and multicultural realities. A pluralistic view recognizes that citizenship and identity are shaped by multiple factors such as culture, language, environment, gender, ideology, religion, spirituality and philosophy.

Definition of Social Studies


Social studies is the study of people in relation to each other and to their world. It is an issues-focused and inquiry-based interdisciplinary subject that draws upon history, geography, ecology, economics, law, philosophy, political science and other social science disciplines. Social studies foster students' understanding of and involvement in practical and ethical issues that face their communities and humankind. Social studies is integral to the process of enabling students to develop an understanding of who they are, what they want to become and the society in which they want to live.

The Role of Social Studies

Social studies develops the key values and attitudes, knowledge and understanding, and skills and processes necessary for students to become active and responsible citizens, engaged in the democratic process and aware of their capacity to effect change in their communities, society and world.

Social Studies Program Foundations and Conceptual Framework

The program of studies provides a foundation of learning experiences that address critical aspects of social studies and its application. These critical areas provide general direction for the program of studies and identify major components of its structure.



Core Concepts of Citizenship and Identity

The dynamic relationship between citizenship and identity forms the basis for skills and learning outcomes in the program of studies.

The goal of social studies is to provide learning opportunities for students to:

- understand the principles underlying a democratic society
- demonstrate a critical understanding of individual and collective rights
- understand the commitment required to ensure the vitality and sustainability of their changing communities at the local, provincial, national and global levels
- validate and accept differences that contribute to the pluralistic nature of Canada
- respect the dignity and support the equality of all human beings.

The sense of being a citizen, enjoying individual and collective rights and equitable status in contemporary society, impacts an individual's sense of identity. Individuals need to feel that their identities are viewed as legitimate before they can contribute to the public good and feel a sense of belonging and empowerment as citizens.

Social studies provides learning opportunities for students to:

- understand the complexity of identity formation in the Canadian context
- understand how identity and self-esteem are shaped by multiple personal, social, linguistic and cultural factors
- demonstrate sensitivity to the personal and emotional aspects of identity
- demonstrate skills required to maintain individuality within a group
- understand that with empowerment comes personal and collective responsibility for the public good.

General and Specific Outcomes

The general and specific outcomes provide an organizational structure for assessment of student progress in the social studies program. These outcomes follow the progression of learning that occurs at each grade level.

General Outcomes

General outcomes identify what students are expected to know and be able to do upon completion of a grade/course. General outcomes have been identified within each grade/course.

Specific Outcomes

Specific outcomes identify explicit components of values and attitudes, knowledge and understanding, and skills and processes that are contained within each general outcome within each grade/course. Specific outcomes are building blocks that enable students to achieve general outcomes for each grade/course. Where appropriate, examples have been identified as an optional (e.g.) or required (i.e.) component of the specific outcome. At the 10–12 levels, all bracketed items are required components of the specific outcome.

Outcomes Related to Values and Attitudes

The goal of social studies is to foster the development of values and attitudes that enable students to participate actively and responsibly as citizens in a changing and pluralistic society. Attitudes are an expression of values and beliefs about an issue or topic. Respect, a sense of personal and collective responsibility, and an appreciation of human interdependence are fundamental to citizenship and identity within local, national and global communities. Developing an ethic of care toward self, others and the natural world is central to these commitments.

Outcomes Related to Knowledge and Understanding

Outcomes related to knowledge and understanding are fundamental to informed decision making. Knowledge and understanding involve the breadth and depth of information, concepts, evidence, ideas and opinions.

Outcomes Related to Skills and Processes

The specific outcomes for skills and processes provide opportunities for students to apply their learning to relevant situations and to develop, practise and maintain essential skills as their learning evolves within a grade/course and from grade to grade/course to course. The skill outcomes are grouped into the following categories for organizational purposes:

- Dimensions of Thinking
- Social Participation as a Democratic Practice
- Research for Deliberative Inquiry
- Communication

Scope and Sequence

The core concepts and six strands of the Alberta Social Studies Kindergarten to Grade 12 Program of Studies are reflected in each grade/course. The structure provides continuity and linkages from grade to grade/course to course. In addition, the general outcomes in each grade/course are components of the one central theme reflected in the grade/course title.



The resource was designed to meet applicable specific outcomes in the curriculum for the new Social Studies Grade 9 and Social Studies 10-1 and 10-2 programs of study. This resource addresses specific outcomes and issues in grades 9 and 10 that are relevant to the relationship between human rights and the quality of life of people living in Canada.

The Building Human Rights Communities: A Resource for Teaching and Learning about Human Rights, Citizenship, Quality of Life and Communities teaching resource provides a variety of lessons, activities, backgrounders, student handouts, learning tools and assessment rubrics that introduce students to human rights and provide a model for students to create a human rights community in the school or in the community. 

The National Canada's Brands: Can They Compete?

Support Resource Grade(s) 9

This program examines economic decision making, consumer behaviour and the challenges and opportunities of manufacturing and marketing products made in Canada through short news reports about four Canadian companies—Stanfield's, The Green Beaver Company, Silver Jeans and Mountain Equipment Co-op. Produced by the Canadian Broadcasting Corporation, the video examines what is faced by each of the four companies in maintaining their production facilities in Canada. Given an increase in manufacturing costs in North America, e.g., labour and materials, and less expensive manufacturing available in locations such as Asia, the task of producing goods in Canada has become more difficult as companies try to compete with more cost-efficient goods made overseas. Each report is narrated by a different journalist, who introduces the audience to the origins and history of each company. Owners or CEOs of each company discuss the cost pressures of running a company within Canada and the choices they have had to make to stay competitive in the manufacturing market.

The program also explores the reasons why some companies are maintaining the bulk of their production facilities in Canada. Brand loyalty, brand recognition and quality are discussed as factors for Canadian consumers who choose to purchase Canadian-made goods. The program also discusses consumer behaviour in relationship to economic decision making, specifically those who choose price over production origin as their factor in decision making.

• Each company featured in this program has a Web site that teachers can direct students to for further follow up.

• Teachers should be aware that this book provides limited perspectives on various topics and issues. A wider range of perspectives may need to be considered.

• The section beginning on page 28 is entitled *Fostering Tolerance*. Teachers may wish to use a more accepting term such as empathy.

This series effectively addresses several major aspects of physical regions, such as region location, natural resources, occupations, major centres and impacts on quality of life. Climate and weather, in the context of potential natural disasters, is also discussed. Specific Outcome 5.2.2 is supported with some content relating to the diversity of First Nations groups living in each of the geographic regions. This series provides a balanced approach to the historical and traditional theories relating to the arrival of the First Nations in North America. Early explorers are also examined.

Comments:

• The word nomadic is present in *The Canadian Shield*, *The Appalachian* and *The Interior Plains* books; however, it is defined as "movement to different locations which is dependent on the season."

• There is also mixed use of terminology such as Blood and Peigan, as well as T'suu T'ina (rather than Sarcee), which may lead to some confusion for students studying First Nations living in the Interior Plains region.

• Celebrating Families supports General Outcome 1.2, Specific Outcomes 1.2.1 and 1.2.2 and General Outcome 3.1 and Specific Outcome 3.1.2. Celebrating Families has sections on family roles and family memories.

• Contributing to Family and Community supports General Outcome K.1, Specific Outcome K.1.2; General Outcome 1.1.1, Specific Outcomes 1.1.3 and 1.1.4, and also General Outcome 2.2. This resource looks at family within a larger community and poses a series of questions and exercises to develop this theme.

• *I Can Make a Difference* addresses General Outcome K.1, Specific Outcomes K.1.4. and K.S.6; General Outcome 1.1, Specific Outcomes 1.1.2 and 1.1.4 by exploring the topics of meeting our (individual) responsibilities and acting out of kindness.

Comments:

• These books contain supplemental ideas and activities that teachers can use to add to a unit of study in several subject areas.

• Additionally, Grade 2 and Grade 3 teachers may find individual activities in the books adaptable to grade specific social studies content.

• Careful consideration should be given to the sensitivities of both the student audience and the community when using activities involving family life and decision making.

Chow Dong Hoy: Portraits from the Frontier

Teaching Resource Grade(s) 5

Chow Dong Hoy: Portraits from the Frontier is a chaptered DVD that presents the photographic contributions of C. D. Hoy and examines the many cultures living together while building a frontier community. Emigrating from China to Canada at the turn of the 20th century, Hoy photographed life in frontier British Columbia and visually recorded towns and their people. Capturing images of many First Nations individuals, Chinese settlers and Caucasian settlers, Hoy portrayed the daily life of his subjects rather than promoting the ethnographic myths of the "noble savage" or the "exotic Oriental." A photographic archive of over 1000 images warmly presents a new perspective of a community that endured hardships and struggles. This video supports General Outcome 5.2 by providing opportunities for students to understand Canadian history and the stories and ways of life of Canada's people. This DVD is a rich source of primary information that has the ability to support many inquiry activities in the classroom; however, the content is complex and requires guided viewing by the teacher. Segmented viewing is also recommended, as this DVD does not have a teacher's guide. Teachers must carefully fit the content of this DVD to the social studies curriculum.

Comments:

• The level of presentation is quite high for Grade 5 students, but the DVD is well worth presenting as it supports inquiry learning.

• This resource requires teacher guidance and classroom discussion to ensure that students understand concepts and make curriculum connections.

• The content of this DVD fits with many curricular areas; the DVD may be used over several classroom periods to make full use of the content. Teachers should preview this DVD to plan how best to integrate the resource into their lessons.

• After students view Chapter 1, teachers need to ensure that students move beyond any stereotypes portrayed and begin to understand the authentic daily lives of peoples in the West.

These two documentaries examine issues, in nature and in urban settings, related to climate change in Canada. Using a local and current affairs approach, the videos address these environmental issues and their quality-of-life and economic impact on Canadians. Produced by the Canadian Broadcasting Corporation, the documentaries provide narrative and illustrative examples to present issues related to climate change. *Climate Change I* presents the impact of shrinking glaciers, mountain pine beetles and warmer weather on vineyards and shipping rights. These are related to environmental and economic impacts and, to some extent, social and health impacts. Discussions about changes to Canada's sovereignty and to the environment, land and peoples in parts of northern Canada are also included. *Climate Change II* examines the impact of climate change on human health; insect-born diseases, heat stroke, respiratory and cardiac illnesses are explored.

The video supports elements of Outcomes 9.2.1, 9.2.3, 9.2.6.4 and General Outcome 9.2 (quality of life) and Local and Current Affairs.

Comments:

• Some of the vocabulary used in the video may be difficult for some Grade 9 students.

Cautions:

• The context is focused on Canada, but the video does contain some global references regarding environmental issues.

• Prior to using the video, it is recommended that teachers preview its contents and consider the context of their classrooms in order to ensure that a full balance of perspectives on these potentially sensitive issues is presented. © 2007

This documentary examines some environmental and economic perspectives regarding issues related to the mining of the oil sands in Alberta. Produced by the Canadian Broadcasting Corporation, the video includes different perspectives on the debate regarding the economic benefits and environmental challenges of the development of the oil sands in Alberta, particularly those of: David Schindler (University of Alberta, Professor of Ecology), Simon Dyer (Pembina Institute), Rob Renner (Environment Minister, the Government of Alberta), Ray Ladouceur (Elder, Fort Chipewyan, Alberta), Dr. Kevin Timoney (Ecologist, Treeline Ecological Research) and Greg Stringham (Canadian Association of Petroleum Producers). Some concerns with contaminated water, air quality and health risks as well as economic risks are presented. An environmental group proposes possible steps to achieving a balance regarding the use of the resource and the environment. The provincial government of Alberta also proposes some solutions regarding sustainability, including emissions, possible new laws, and balancing the needs of the environment and the economy.

Outcomes: This documentary supports elements of 9.1.3, 9.2.5 and 9.2.6.4, as well as Local and Current Affairs.

Comments:

Cautions:





The Power of Place: Geography for the 21st Century Ethnic Fragmentation in Canada

Support Resource Grade(s) 9

This two-section report examines different perspectives on what happens when ethnic composition of neighbourhoods changes, specifically exploring the influence of immigrants on the communities of Vancouver and Montreal. Both sections of the video include a narrator and interviews with immigrants and Canadian citizens. A selection of maps is interspersed throughout the video along with charts and other graphics.

The first section explores immigration to Vancouver, primarily focusing on the immigration period prior to the Chinese takeover of Hong Kong in 1999 when wealthy business people moved their families to Vancouver from Hong Kong. Conflicts related to housing design regulations and culture are explored, illustrating the development of a cultural and regulation compromise in Vancouver. The decline of wealthy business immigration and more recent Asian immigration to Vancouver from India, China and the Philippines is also explored.

The second section looks at the influence of immigration on Montreal and somewhat on the Francophone community in Québec and the rest of Canada. The scenario offers perspectives on why many immigrants are choosing to educate their children in English rather than French and what the Québec government is doing to promote the French language.

The DVD supports 9.1.7.4, 9.1.8.1 and 9.1.8.2 and some elements of 9.1.8.4, 9.1.8.5. 9.1.8.7, 9.S.3.1 and 9.S.3.4.

Comments:

• While a student-friendly resource, teachers should be aware that parts of the DVD are slightly dated; the initial portion of the Vancouver example is possibly best seen as a historical event (e.g., it could be interpreted that wealthy business entrepreneurs are no longer emigrating from Hong Kong in the same numbers as prior to 1999). The Montreal example is both a historical and a current event and presents a perspective regarding maintaining the French language in Québec and in Canada.

• Some viewers may have different perspectives and points of view regarding the impact of immigration and language choice.

The resource guides the students through structured activities designed to promote positive group and social actions; 21 activities are provided, including defining leadership, communicating with style, choosing tolerance and turning conflict into cooperation. The student resource structures each lesson with topical quotes, an introduction and "Find out more about it," "Think and write about it" and "Do something about it" sections; metacognition and goal setting are incorporated into the lessons in a structured manner. The student resource also provides definitions of terms pertinent to group work and social action, and contains bulleted lists of guides for successful interaction.

Building Everyday Leadership in All Teens is a teacher's guide that supports the student resource. It contains suggestions for lesson preparation, directions on what to teach and thumbnail pictures of the student resource. The guide also includes some blackline masters, activities to extend the learning beyond the student text and possible student responses.

The resource supports elements of the Skills and Processes Outcomes 9.S.1., 9.S.4, 9.S.5 and 9.S.8.

Comments:

There are sections of the student resource and the teacher's guide that contain activities for which additional guidance and support is recommended:

• Teachers should use caution in the Prejudice Brainstorming Activity on page 75 of the teacher's guide as it has the potential for some sensitivities to arise when completing this activity with the students.

• The Supplemental Materials section of the teacher's guide on pages 180–192 provides additional suggested resources that have not been reviewed by Alberta Education.

• Page 73 of the student resource uses an inaccurate definition of "-ism."

• As the student resource includes the "Do something about it" section, it is recommended that teachers monitor student suggestions for actions in order to help guide age-appropriate behaviour for social involvement as responsible citizens contributing to their community.

• As the student resource contains some optional areas for inclusion of student answers/responses, teachers may wish to provide students with additional instruction on where to record their responses in order to be able to reuse the student resource more easily.

In Brands We Trust

Support Resource Grade(s) 9

This chaptered documentary analyzes the impact that the branding of products can potentially have on people and on their economic decision making and what they value in society. A narrator guides viewers through the documentary, summarizing key points and linking together key messages from interviews with leading experts and company representatives that are interspersed throughout the video, with some interviews in English and some in French with English subtitles. The evolution of branding is explored over time, with the documentary proposing that there has been a shift from past strategies for marketing that were product centered to contemporary strategies for marketing that are more lifestyle centered, emphasizing image, identity and branding more so than the product. Brands are presented as marketing ideas, identity and values to people more so than the use of the products alone.

Companies and brands from different countries are discussed with focus on Canada, the United States and France. Several well-recognized brand names are used as examples, including Nike, Channel, Coca-Cola, Pepsi, Michelin, Apple, Levi's, Gap, Sony, Molson's, Roots and Benetton. The ideas about branding are presented largely from a Western perspective and address elements of General Outcome 9.2 regarding marketing. branding and consumer behaviour and their relationship to economic decision making, identity and guality of life.

Outcomes 9.2.2, 9.2.4.5 and 9.2.5.3 and elements of 9.S.1.2 and 9.S.2.2 are addressed in this resource.

The video explores a sequence of historical events and strategies that lead to the legal recognition of the Nisga'a Nation's land claim and looks at the importance of this agreement for the Nisga'a people. The video is a part of the *Nisga'a Nation* series and is told from Nisga'a perspectives.

The story weaves through traditional, legal and political strategies as the Nisga'a pursued recognition by the Government of Canada of their land claim. The influence of explorers, missionaries and politicians on the Nisga'a is presented as part of the history leading up to this event. The importance of the Royal Proclamation of 1763 and the premise that it can be seen as the basis for First Nations land claims is also presented as playing a part in the Nisga'a gaining legal title to their land. The DVD also shares interviews with Nisga'a leaders and their supporters to provide a recent historical context. Supreme Court decisions and their impact on the Canadian government add to the viewers' understanding of the big picture related to governance and rights, including that of the 2001 Calder Case involving the Nisga'a. The story of the vote in the Canadian Parliament leading to legal title is followed by video of Her Excellency the Governor General visiting the Nisga'a Nation. The agreement between the Nisga'a Nation and the Government of Canada, the Nisga'a Final Agreement, provides an example of a contemporary treaty and a land claims agreement.

Outcomes: The DVD addresses elements of Outcome 9.1.7 (recognition of collective rights impacting the legislative process in Canada) and 9.1.2 (effects of government policies on citizenship and on Canadian society).

Cautions:

• The video is presented from Nisga'a perspectives.

• The DVD opens with a statement about the Nisga'a "suffering a century and a half of colonial oppression" and contains some historical references to the term "white" to refer to European settlers in Canada.

• Some parts of the video may also be somewhat sophisticated for some Grade 9 students.



The story is retold through a mix of poetry and biography. *The Poet King of Tezcoco* is divided into the following sections: *His Birth and Tribulations of His Youth*; *The Fugitive Prince*; *His Rise to the Throne*; *Poet and Statesman*; *The Heart of an Architect*, *Hardship, Misfortune and Conflict*, *Child of the Sun and the Moon*; *Calamities and Wonders*; and *Nezahualcoyotl's Will*. The poetry and illustrations make this book appealing for students. These visual images are enhanced by the dialogue, music and other sound effects. *Postcards from Canada* provides a good basis to stimulate students' investigation of Canadian history and culture.



Descriptions of how these achievements have influenced modern day life are also presented. This resource provides critical thinking opportunities and opportunities for further research. It also contains a teacher's guide that provides the following: *Program Summary, Vocabulary, Pre-viewing Discussion, Focus Questions, Follow-up Discussion, Follow-up Activities* and *Suggested Internet and Printed Resource Lists*. General Outcome 8.2 and Specific Outcomes 8.2.1, 8.2.2, 8.2.3 and 8.2.4 are addressed.

• Parallels to some learning concepts in the Grade 6 Social Studies curriculum are evident.

Respecting Beliefs: Muslims, Christians, Jews & Other Religions

Support Resource Grade(s) 8

Developed by the Canadian Learning Company, this video introduces basic concepts related to Judaism, Christianity, Islam, Buddhism and atheism to illustrate commonalities and some differences among a few religions or belief systems of the world. The resource provides a brief interpretation of the historical background for each of these religions or belief systems, emphasizes their commonalities and supports respect for their differences.

Interviews with youth who have different religions or belief systems are central to this video and are linked together by a narrator. Information, questions for students and a five-part process for respectfully exploring various religions or belief systems are included on the screen during some of the interviews and as part of the narration.

The resource is accompanied by a short, printed booklet/program guide that includes brief background information and some possible questions/activities. Students can use the resource to develop a basic understanding of how the expression of a person's religion or belief system can impact how he or she views the world. This supports the Grade 8 theme of examining worldviews.

Comments:

• This resource is a potential starting point for explorations of various religions or belief systems and of possible connections to people's worldviews. Overall, the video's religious categories tend to be simplified in order to make this topic more accessible for students. Each of the American youth interviewed in the video provides his or her own experience and understanding of his or her own religion or belief system; the youth provide an interpretation of religion largely as a set of cultural practices that they have experienced. No one interview is intended to reflect all people's beliefs within a particular religion or belief system or to be *the* set of "facts" about that faith. In the same way, the information given on the screen, in the narration and in the printed material is representative of one particular interpretation of a religion or belief system only and is not intended to reflect the beliefs of all peoples. Diversity within these faiths would need to be explored to reflect multiple perspectives about these faiths.

• For reference, some more specific comments and cautions are noted below to support use of this resource:

• In the video, the narrator states her own beliefs clearly, reflecting a perspective that somewhat equates culture as worldview. The narrator also presents a positive view of religion and belief systems, potentially based on the assumption that belief systems guide people's lives. The narrator and the video are focused on respect of belief systems and do not address elements of conflict or interrelationships among belief systems. The information about different religions is also generally presented from the points of view of youth/students. Further discussion would be beneficial in order to clarify and expand on their points.

• The placement of the religious symbol of the Christian cross in the centre of the title screen, surrounded by the Jewish Star of David and the starcrescent intending to represent Islam, could be seen as a value judgment by some. As well, use of the star-crescent to represent Islam is reflective of one perspective; it is not necessarily a widely agreed upon symbol to represent Islam and may not be accepted by some people of Islamic faith. Further, the video states that Muslims believe Muhammad to be the first Muslim; however, some people of this faith may have a different interpretation and believe this to be inaccurate. It is also important to note that the video reflects what some could consider an American perspective or interpretation of the belief systems it discusses. The video also implies that the status of atheism is parallel, as a formal belief system, to the religions discussed.

• The statistics and facts provided in the charts and in the narrative tend to be simplified, potentially to increase accessibility of the video; this sometimes provides room for interpretation on the source/accuracy of the information being shared, depending on the point of view of the viewer.

For example, the first chart demonstrates that Christianity is the most widespread religion, but does not necessarily clarify that this includes both Protestants and Catholics. By some accounts, the most widespread world religion could be Islam, depending on how the statistics are compiled. As well, the video states that Judaism was founded by Abraham 4000 years ago; this statement could be preceded in the classroom with the idea that this is what many Jews may believe. Teachers could point out that in the absence of any reliable historical record, some of the general statements in the video could be presented as articles of faith or perhaps sacred stories or beliefs. Additional sources and a discussion about perspectives could provide context for these statistics.

• The video contains an explanation for using the term *respect* in place of the term *tolerance*, including discussion of the connotations associated with each term.

• The video itself is somewhat dated in its presentation style.

• The program guide for teachers mirrors the contents of the video; accordingly, the comments and cautions listed above are equally relevant for the program guide. The sources for statistics and the definitions in the program guide are general in nature and would benefit from further discussion and contextualization in the classroom. Some of the suggested activities would be recommended over the true/false questions in the guide to engage students in thinking about beliefs and worldviews. Based on interpretation, some of the items in the definitions and fact sheet sections could also be seen as inaccurate. For example, in the definitions, in the description of Muslims and prayer, some might consider it more accurate to state that Muslims face the Kaaba in their prayers. In the fact sheet, questions over the following could arise: the largest religion in the world, whether Buddha was a god, countries that have an "official religion," the country that has the largest Muslim population, beliefs of some "Native tribes" in the world, and the role of saints. In the references sections, the Web site listings are more supportive for teachers than the bibliographic sources provided.

• Teachers should consider further contextualizing the video materials in a Canadian, Alberta and classroom-specific context for their students. As part of this contextualization, teachers should be ready to supplement the video with additional materials about the faiths it explores (e.g., different types of Buddhist and Islamic faiths) and with materials on other faiths or belief systems, such as Hinduism, Taoism, Confucianism, Aboriginal or Indigenous belief systems, or faiths that are present in the school's own community. Teachers need to keep in mind that any materials based on the topic of religion and belief systems could contain interpretations that may not be embraced by all people of a faith.

• When using this video, teachers should encourage students to engage in critical thinking about religion and belief systems and about potential links to specific locations and cultures in the world and to people's personal and collective worldviews. Teachers may ask questions such as "What is religion?" "Are religions and belief systems expressed and interpreted in the same way in different locations in the world?" "Are there diverse groups within a belief system who express their beliefs in different ways?" "How can a person's belief system and where he/she lives impact his/her worldview?" Providing this type of critical thinking context when using the video should strengthen the video's support of outcomes for the Grade 8 program.

• Differentiated instruction for various learner levels may be accommodated. The teacher's guide includes activities that students may complete independently or in a small group.

Canada, The Place is a multicomponent kit that integrates both the social studies and language arts curricula in a cross-disciplinary approach. Through an exploration of fiction and nonfiction, this kit introduces students to social studies and language arts content and skills. The kit supports General Outcome 5.1 and specifically addresses how Canadian identity is shaped by the physical geography of Canada. The Complete Unit focuses on the provinces and territories of Canada, comparing the diverse physical regions and environments within them and examining the exchange of goods and resources among them. Student resource components include *Jacob's Little Giant, WOW Canada!, At Grandpa's Sugar Bush, Duncan's Way, The Inukshuk Book, A Mountain Alphabet, Prairie Summer, White Stone in the Castle Wall and Maps of Canada Pack. The student resources are visually appealing and reflect students' real-world experiences. Also included in this kit is a <i>Teaching Resource Book* that is designed to provide both general and specific support for teachers. The teaching resource includes a description of the philosophy of the kit and its components, classroom management suggestions, assessment strategies and tools, suggestions for teaching lessons, and blackline masters.

Comments:

• Some of the individual books do not portray a balance of racial/ethnic groups in Canadian society.

• In Wow Canada! references to Aboriginal sites and people and Canadian institutions are sometimes irreverent. Careful consideration should be given to the sensitivities of both the student audience and the community in using Wow Canada!.

Social Studies Through Literature: K-2 (Kit) (12 Novels + Teaching Resource)

This kit includes 12 focus books and a teacher's guide. The books are: Arctic Stories, Alphabet City, Alison's House, Franklin's Neighbourhood, Chin Chiang and the Dragon's Dance, Boundless Grace, Jeremiah Learns to Read, A Prairie Alphabet, A Boy of Tache, David Goes to School, Something from Nothing and Morning on the Lake. Each of these books support some (at least one) social studies outcomes for grades K–2 and can be linked to other curricular areas including language arts and art. Some of the books can be used as teacher read-aloud and others possibly as independent readers for Grade 1 and Grade 2. For each book, the user-friendly teacher's guide includes blackline masters, assessment strategies and multiple activities that would be very effective in a differentiated classroom setting.

Comments:

• The following two focus books, referenced in the teacher guide, are not recommended for the K-3 social studies curriculum: *Revenge of the small Small* by Jean Little, and *This is the Way We Go to School* by Edith Baer, are not included in this kit.

• Arctic Stories contains sensitive information about residential schools and there are also religious references. Alberta Education strongly recommends that teachers preview this resource.

The program is fast-paced and would be best used in individual sections one at a time. The video meets many of the geographical thinking outcomes for grades 1, 2 and 3. **Comments:**

- The video contains some American content; however, this does not detract from the video's message.
- Imperial measurement is used.

The Voices and Visions resource package was developed to meet Alberta Education curriculum outcomes for Grade 7 social studies. The package supports the general outcomes—Toward Confederation; Following Confederation: Canadian Expansions— as well as specific outcomes and skills and processes. The resource package consists of a student text, a comprehensive teacher's resource with a multimedia CD–ROM package and an online resource centre.

Each chapter in the student text features a skill check, a biography, a case study, information on identity and a chapter project. An individual chapter begins with a question addressing the inquiry of the chapter and then identifies the key concept to be addressed in the chapter.

Written from the perspective of a Spanish missionary who moved to Mexico in the 16th century, this book details the life of the Aztec people prior to the arrival of the Spanish conquistadors. Friar de Sahagun lived among the Aztecs in order to learn their language, beliefs and customs. The book accurately depicts Aztec religious rituals, the Aztec art of divination and Aztec governance, trade and warfare. The drawings originate from the manuscript version of the General History, which is known as the Florentine Codex. What the Aztecs Told Me supports General Outcome 8.3 and Specific Outcome 8.3.2.

Where Strangers Become Neighbours

Support Resource Grade(s) 9

This DVD examines issues related to immigration in Canada and provides a specific example of a multiple-perspectives analysis of the Collingwood neighbourhood in Vancouver. The video includes a perspective-based view of the impact of immigration on quality of life and citizenship within the community. It balances the concerns of long-term residents and new immigrants in developing their community. The video also uses a variety of techniques to support the narration, such as interviews, on-screen text, maps and moving text.

Focusing on the case study, the DVD presents perspectives from long-term residents of the Collingwood neighbourhood regarding the changes that took place over a 20-year span, beginning in 1980—a movement from a heterogeneous Anglo-Saxon community to a multiethnic community. Incorporating the voices of new immigrants, long-term community residents and First Nations community members, the video examines how the neighbourhood adapted to provide the needed services and to develop a sense of community and sharing, engaging in a community cultural development process, including an arts powwow and Collingwood neighbourhood house and park development. The multiple-perspective comments shared are largely those of women in the community, examining the social services needed and the manner in which the community has worked together to adapt and provide these services. The DVD details how the community addressed changing attitudes, language and child-care concerns and developed a centre for recreational, cultural and arts activities. *Where Strangers Become Neighbours* presents a respectful and multiple-perspective treatment of issues related to immigration.

The outcomes addressed are 9.1.8 (emerging issues of immigration) with an emphasis on 9.1.8.7 ("To what extent does Canada benefit from immigration?") and some elements of 9.1.8.1 and 9.1.8.6. The video also addresses larger General Outcome 9.1; e.g., citizenship, identity and quality of life implications related to immigration, governance and rights.

Comments:

• The voices in the video are largely those of women in the community. Only perspectives and points of view of some of the people and groups that live in the community of Collingwood are present in the video.

Willa's New World begins in London, 1795, with recently-orphaned 15-year-old Willa Thompson boarding a merchant ship going to a Hudson's Bay post in the New World. Willa endures the cramped, difficult journey and makes her way to York Factory.

There, Master George, the chief factor, who becomes her protector, gives her a job as a clerk. Amelia, an Aboriginal cook, befriends Willa and tells her about the customs and beliefs of her people. With the support of these two, Willa finally begins to adapt to her new life, but when Willa declines a marriage proposal from George, he "transfers" her to Fort Edmonton House. Amelia's brother, cousin and mother escort her there. During this long and difficult journey, she suffers a vicious attack by one of the townspeople, but ultimately begins to appreciate the beauty of the new world and its people.


