
Student Engagement Wheel (For Teachers to Self-Assess)

The Student Engagement Wheel

The Student Engagement Wheel is a self-assessment tool for teachers to check the engagement level of their students. The Wheel has ten spokes. Each spoke represents a different way in which you can get your students engaged in the lesson. If you use the Wheel before your lesson, you can scan the areas on the spokes of the Wheel to see which ones you hope to accomplish. If you are reflecting after a lesson, you can actually measure class engagement level numerically. The number is determined by the number of spokes that you have accomplished in that lesson. For instance, if your class participated in a partner or group activity, then you could count that spoke. Add up all the spokes that are true for that class period and you would have an idea of the engagement level for your students. Ideally you would get an average score for the same class measured over an entire week.
