- Principle 1: Childhoods differ depending on social and cultural circumstances • Principle 2: Children's development is influenced but not determined by their early experiences
- Principle 3: Children interact and learn in a variety of contexts Principle 4: Children are co-constructors of knowledge and partners in learning
- Principle 5: Children are unique and active contributors to their learning Principle 6: Children construct and represent knowledge in a variety of ways
- Principle 7: Children are citizens and active participants in school and society
- Principle 8: Children are active collaborators in and users of assessment
