





Mental health, school success, and life success are strongly linked.








Provincial Assessments - PATs, DIPS


- All students are eligible for accommodations and provisions to write Provincial
 Achievement Tests without an application process. Accommodations, for the purpose of
 writing Provincial Achievement Tests, are reviewed, managed, and ordered by school
 personnel. Students must understand and adhere to the accommodation and provision
 administration directives, rules and procedures of writing a Provincial Achievement Test
 with the use of accommodations and provisions. PATs
- All students may use additional writing time (up to twice the allotted test time), if needed. Students do not need to declare the use of this provision before writing a diploma exam.
- Grade 9 Mathematics: Part(ie) A (without a calculator) This part contains numerical-response questions


